

Melbourne Man Arrested For Operating A Craft Brewery Without A Beard

A Melbourne man has been arrested this morning after it was brought to the attention of authorities that he was operating a craft brewery without a beard.

Victoria Police surrounded the northside brewery at 10.45am and placed Mr Nix Bristles into custody. Mr Bristles' brewery had only opened its doors a few weeks before his arrest and word of his reckless behaviour quickly spread amongst the craft beer community.
